



STATEWIDE SURVEY TRANSPORTATION FUNDING KEY FINDINGS

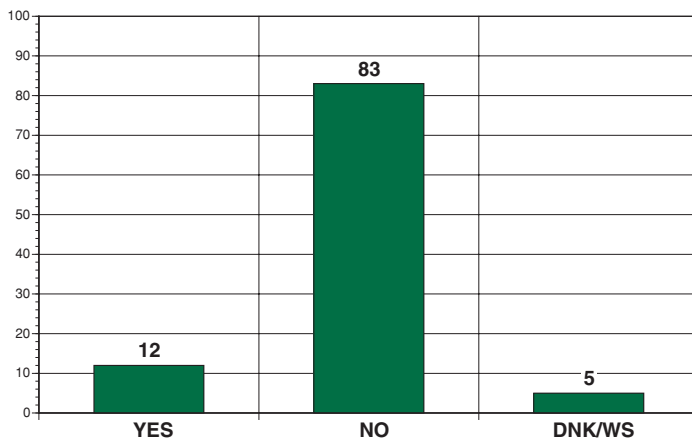
ABOUT THE POLL

A statewide telephone survey was developed and conducted by Southern Media & Opinion Research with 600 likely Louisiana voters from Friday, August 3, 2007, through Thursday, August 9, 2007. The overall margin of error for the statewide statistics obtained from the survey data is not greater than plus or minus 4.0 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence.

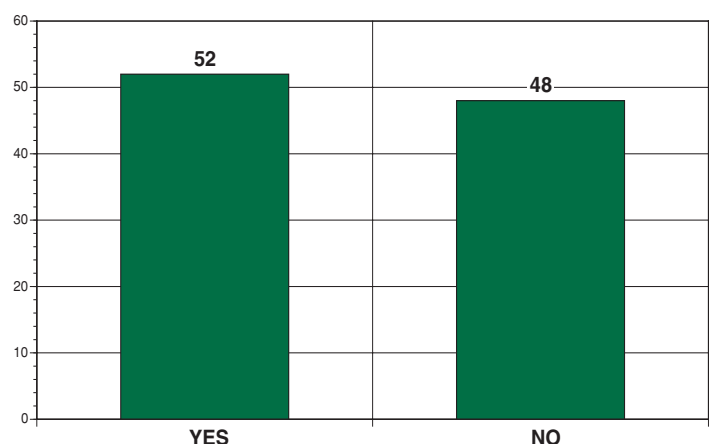
Key findings of the survey include:

- An overwhelming majority of respondents (82%) believed not enough state money is being spent to improve roads and transportation.
- More than half (51%) of the respondents were aware of Louisiana's \$14 billion backlog in road construction and transportation needs.
- More than three out of four respondents (80%) favored shifting the state sales taxes on automobiles and trucks and truck registration fees to the transportation trust fund and away from the state general fund.
- When respondents were asked whether they favored the shift even if it meant there would be less money in the state general fund for other state programs, 69% still favored the shift.
- More than half of respondents (57%) would be more inclined to vote for a candidate for the legislature who was committed to shifting more money from the state general fund to the transportation trust fund.

In your opinion, is enough state money being spent to improve roads and transportation?

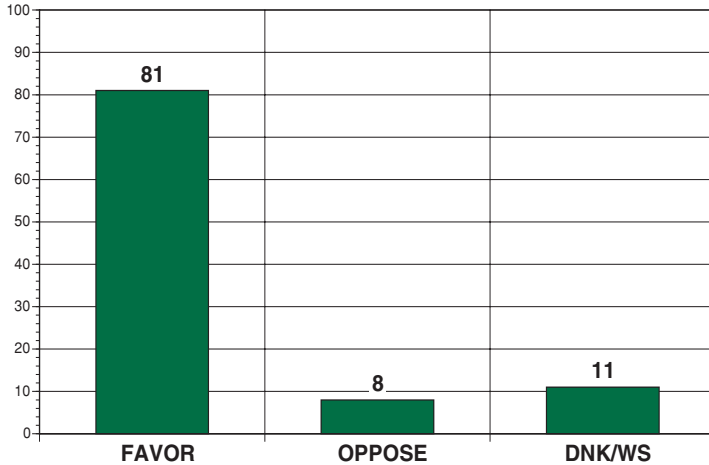


Were you aware that Louisiana has a \$14 billion backlog of road construction and transportation needs?

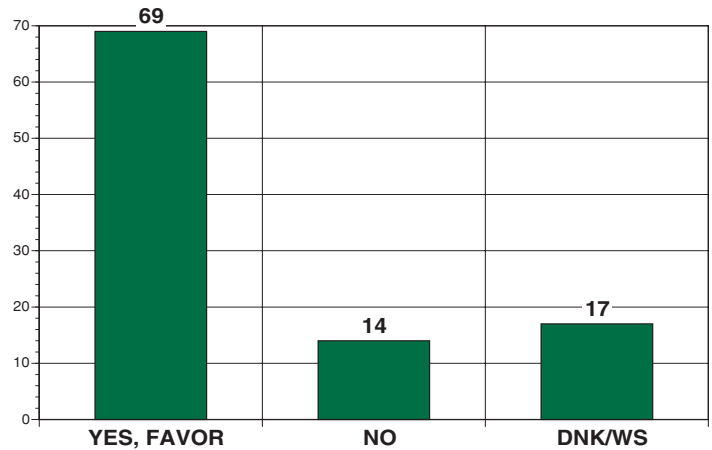

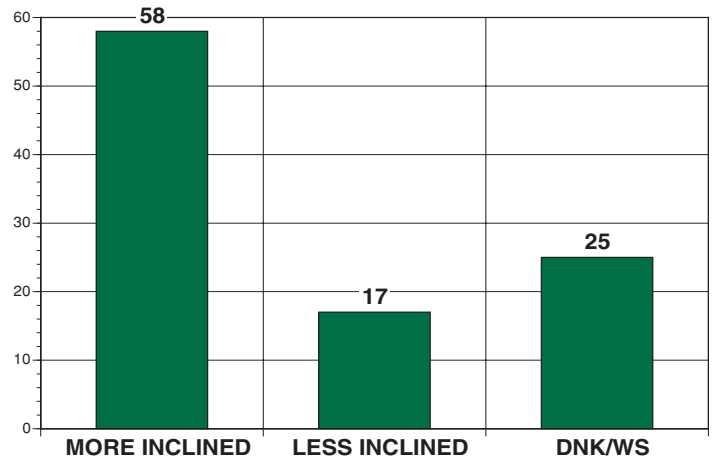
